Wendt's 1992 article "Anarchy is What States Make of It: the Social Construction of Power Politics" published in International Organization laid the theoretical groundwork for challenging what he considered to be a flaw shared by both neorealists and neoliberal institutionalists, namely, a commitment to a (crude) form of materialism.

The core of Alexander Wendt's theorization of international politics consists in his intellectual endeavour to develop a theory of the international system as a "social construction," which lies in stark contrast to the positivist and materialist conceptions of IR as theorized particularly by realists and liberalists.

Alexander Wendt (born 12 June 1958) is an American political scientist who is one of the core social constructivist researchers in the field of international relations, and a key contributor to quantum social science.
